

■ New book reveals Upstairs-**Downstairs life in Kerry**

■ Historians examine world of county's landed elite

A GROUNDBREAKING new book featuring contributions by some of the county's leading historians on the history of the Big House in Kerry has been published by Tralee couple Maurice and Jane O'Keeffe.

The homes of the county's gentry and nobility the length and breadth of Kerry are explored in the lavishly illustrated volume, via the iconic buildings which once dominated the local landscape.

Twelve historians contribute to the book, which also features photographs from the collection of the late Tralee historian Russell MacMorran, who travelled the county with his camera cap-

turing images of buildings many of which have been demolished and lost to time.

According to Maurice and Jane O'Keeffe, the book is hugely significant.

"It's groundbreaking, as such a work which presents the social history of the Big House in Kerry has never been written before.

"Rather than an architectural history, people are very much centre stage," Maurice said.

with the centenary of the destruction of many of the Big Houses during the War of Independence and Irish Civil War.

According to Maurice, the book "covers an area of Irish history which hasn't been looked at before and examines in-depth the lives of the people that lived in the Big Houses in the past".

"Every single article is just fantastic with lots of new information. The book is scholarly but still very readable," he said.

The book, which will retail at €39, features a foreword by Sir Adrian FitzGerald, 24th Knight of Kerry, and an introduction by Milltown native Dr John Knightly.
